

Aragon Pavilion

Expo Zaragoza 2008, Spain



The pavilion is conceived to represent the Autonomous Community of Aragon in the International Exposition of Zaragoza 2008. Its exhibition concept is based on the historical relationship of water with Aragon.

The first exhibition area, located on the second floor, is titled "Aragon: Water and Life", and is made up of a selection of pieces representative of Aragon art, a series of photographs by Jose Veron and audiovisuals that show Aragon's social and cultural potential, based on the conductor wire of the traditional promise by this community in the sustainable use of water.

On the first floor, the audiovisual symphony is played entitled "Aragon: Water and Future", with a spectacular audiovisual directed by Carlos Saura. A 'river' runs through the room full of angular and brilliant black prisms. Finally, projections over the course of the river and an interactive form over the land, show the artistic and cultural richness of Aragon.
